NUMBER

1

Pick a name.
Plan for the future.

What's your 5, 10, 25 year goal?

Do you want employees?

Do you want to sell products?

What happens when you retire?

Will you sell your business?

NUMBER

2

Make it official.

Most likely you'll start as an LLC,
but do your research!

Get to know what is best for your business
and **ASK FOR HELP.**

NUMBER

3

Set up your banking.

Get a business checking account
and a credit card right away!

Even if it sits dormant.

NUMBER

4

Get your contracts
in order.

This could make or break you, especially in the early stages of business.

MONEY SAVING TIP:

To save money, try to find templates *then* go to a lawyer. It costs less to edit rather than starting from scratch.

NUMBER

5

Set up your process
and TEST it.

Think about all the touch points you'll have with your clients.

EXAMPLES

Initial intake form, welcome packet, calendar, wrap up emails, next steps, final project delivery

6

Start the work
you want to do.

Your clients might not always see the vision. You have to hold their hand.

Show them what you've done before and they'll trust you with their brand.

7

Set up your site.

Getting it up and getting you work is
better than nothing at all.

8

Start organizing.

Start organizing your files & assets
now. Practice working like a
real business.
